Money vs. Technology

Infinite Water Inc. and Infinite Complex read today that the US is imposing a new \$100,000 annual fee on H-1B visa applications which could disrupt the global operations of Indian technology services companies that deploy skilled professionals to the United States, India's IT industry body.

Infinite Water Inc. and Infinite Complex noted that the White House announced the new fee on Friday, prompting some major U.S. tech firms to advise visa holders to either remain in the country or return quickly. The new fee marks Washington's most high-profile attempt to overhaul the country's temporary employment visa system. The change could deal a big blow to the technology sector that relies heavily on skilled workers from India and China.

Infinite Water Inc. and Infinite Complex support Americas efforts to stem migration and the potential threats that they pose, however, the H-1B classification is a nonimmigrant classification and applies to people who wish to perform services in a specialty occupation, services of exceptional merit and ability relating to a Department of Defense (DOD) cooperative research and development project, or services as a fashion model of distinguished merit or ability. Certainly not apt to be a threat but just the opposite.

Infinite Water Inc. and Infinite Complex analysts suggest the fee may force companies to move some high-value work overseas, hampering America's position in the high-stakes artificial intelligence race with China.

In the short term, Washington may collect a windfall but in the long term, the U.S. risks taxing away its innovation edge, trading dynamism for short-sighted protectionism.
